SUNDAY SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS

April 4, 2021 – Easter Sunday: Today's Gospel highlights Peter and Mary Magdalene, both of whom found new life in their relationship with Christ. They both needed a second chance, and both found blessing in the miraculous happenings of Easter. Their faith became as "the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth." May we, too, "think of what is above, not of what is on earth." (Acts 10:34a, 37-43, Colossians 3:1-4 or 1 Corinthians 5:6b-8, John 20:1-9)

April 12, 2021 – 2nd Sunday of Easter: On his first Easter appearance Jesus bestowed three significant gifts: peace, the mandate to preach, and the Spirit of reconciliation and mercy. These gifts brought grace as well as obligation. However, the Lord's commandments "are not burdensome," but life-giving. We are grateful to the Lord that through these gifts we are made one with him and with all our brothers and sisters in faith. (Acts 4:32-35, 1 John 5:1-6, John 20:19-31)

April 18, 2021 – 3rd Sunday of Easter: Peter and the other apostles boldly preached that Jesus is the Messiah, put to death as "an explation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world." By his death and resurrection, forgiveness and peace were restored. The charge of Jesus to the disciples of Emmaus is our mission, too: "You are witnesses of these things." (Acts 3:13-15, 17-19, 1 John 2:1-5a, Luke 24:35-48)

April 25, 2021 – 4th Sunday of Easter: The Good Shepherd reminds his followers to be wary of the many voices that call out for allegiance. "The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him." The Son, the cornerstone, was rejected by those who presumed to build. But, we want to recognize Jesus as the cornerstone of our lives, so that we can look forward to being one with him and seeing him "as he is." (Acts 4:8-12, 1 John 3:1-2, John 10:11-18)
