Sunday Scripture Reflections

September 1, 2019 – 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time: Have we been hypocritical for our own gain? We pray for forgiveness and the grace to let our actions reflect our wills. (Luke 14: 1, 7-14)

September 8, 2019 – 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time: The gift of wisdom enables us to walk through life with confidence. The Gospel journey is not an easy one; it is full of distractions and setbacks. If we trust in the gift of wisdom, the Holy Spirit will never lead us astray, but will guide us on the path of life and light. (Luke 14: 25-33)

September 15, 2019 – 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time: When we are forgiven, we are challenged not to forget that for which we have been forgiven. To remember is a healthy way to keep us from repeating our weakness. Forgiving and being forgiven teaches us how to live honestly with our past and remember how to live with grace in the future. (Luke 15: 1-32)

September 22, 2019 – 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time: In this parable about trustworthiness, Jesus was condemning the master and an economic system that turned people into things. When we pray for others, do we project our own ideas about the other rather than genuine concern for their needs? (Luke 16: 1-13)

September 29, 2019 – 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time: The more we have, the more we want. That is what can happen to us. We might forget that God is the giver of all gifts. There is always a better car, a bigger house, or a greater income. The point is that what we possess can become what possesses us. That was the case among the people for whom Amos prophesied. (Amos 6; 1a, 4-7)
